The institute has initiated and promotes the interdisciplinary research among all the departments. Multidisciplinary research study takes place when faculty from different disciplines work independently on a common problem or research question. In this approach, faculty share research goals and work on the same problem, but look at it from their own discipline's perspective. The findings from each discipline are supplementary to each other. Students get maximum flexibility to choose multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary courses as elective as prescribed by the university. Students are encouraged to do their minor/major projects in various interdisciplinary fields. Students are also encouraged to formulate teams from different disciplines to participate in different events conducted by premier institutes and also in Hackathons organised by different institutes. However we are following this approach in study and research work to disseminate more knowledge and to get more funding for research. The Gandhi Institute of Excellent Technocrats (GIET) is making continuous efforts towards implementation of National Educational Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) with CBCS-based flexible curricula supported with multiple Value-Added Courses. In order to address the wide range of educational needs mentioned in the NEP, GIET is preparing itself by encouraging cooperation across departments and academic disciplines. Students who participate in multidisciplinary programs get a comprehensive comprehension of intricate subjects, equipping them to tackle real-life obstacles. Faculty members are also urged to do multidisciplinary research in order to promote creativity and meet social demands. As part of its readiness for the National Education Policy (NEP), the institution intends to prioritize departments such as liberal arts, mathematics, statistics, natural and applied sciences, technologybased learning, athletics, translation, and interpretation. Regardless of the institution where they were taken, this innovative approach enables students to accrue credits for courses completed, giving them more freedom and acknowledgment for a variety of learning

experiences. Through the use of the ABC, GIET hopes to support students in customizing their educational path to best suit their individual interests and professional goals, as well as to allow smooth credit transfer. To help students stay relevant in a work environment that is changing quickly, the ABC also promotes a culture of ongoing skill development. By implementing the Academic Bank of Credits, GIET has shown its dedication to adopting contemporary teaching methods that are consistent with the NEP's goal of creating a more adaptable and accessible higher education system. GIET is affiliated with Biju Patnaik University of Technology, Rourkela, Odisha. We strictly follow the University's choice-based credit system (CBCS). The implementation of CBCS integrates professional and open elective courses into the curriculum, supporting an interdisciplinary approach to solving engineering problems. Students have the opportunity to select open and professional elective subjects alongside NPTEL (MOOCS) courses that run for a minimum of eight weeks, which contributes to the credit-based system. Within the university's guidelines, faculty members are encouraged to develop their own curricula and teaching methodologies for each course. The University sets the standards for assessment. Our faculty members employ various educational strategies including group discussions, quizzes, role plays, case studies, assignments, interactive seminars, workshops, guest lectures, conferences, and practical demonstrations to enhance learning experiences.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special programmes for advanced learners and slow learners. The institution assesses the learning levels of the students in two ways at the time of the commencement of the classes. Students enrolled in various disciplines are identified as slow and advanced learners based on tests conducted by each department. This helps to identify the slow learners and to design special coaching sessions or remedial sessions to bridge the gap between the slow learners and the advanced learners.

Strategies adopted for slow learners:

1. Remedial Classes are conducted with theaim to improve the academic performance of the slow learners. This practice helps the struggling learners to improve subject knowledge.

2. Academic and personal counselling is given to the slow learners.

3. Bilingual explanation and discussions are imparted to the slow learners after the class hours for better understanding.

Strategies adopted for advanced learners:

1. Provision of simple and standard lecture notes for the advanced learners.

2. Coaching is also given in Skill Development Programme like Communicative English, Aptitude and Placement.

3. Assignment and Student Seminars on contemporary topics to enable them for development of the soft skill.

4. Participation by the students in Debate, Group Discussion, Problem-Solving, Decision-Making Exercises and Quiz Programmes are also encouraged.

In Outcome Based Education, assessment is carried out by the department to identify, collect, analyze and evaluate the data towards the achievement of Course Outcomes (CO). The course outcomes are assessed based on direct assessment tools. The direct method of assessment includes the performance of the students in all the relevant assessment tools - Continuous Internal Examination (CIE) like Class Test, Assignments, Quizzes, Surprise Test, Co-curricular Activity/Self Study, and End Examination (ESE). CIE contributes 30% and ESE contributes 70% to the total attainment of a course outcome.

Process of PO and PSO Attainment

Course outcomes are assessed through Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and Semester End Examination (SEE). The analysis is done to find the level of attainments of each course COs. The attainment of POs andPSOs are being calculated based on the COs attainment.For indirect assessments, survey questionnaire is circulated to students, alumni and employer. The surveys are assessed and evaluated to determine the strength of attainment level of POs/PSOs. Survey results from graduates, alumni, and employer are consolidated and the final PO values are calculated through 3-point scale (Excellent, Very Good, and Satisfactory). Overall attainments of POs are calculated by taking 80% of direct attainment and 20% of indirect attainment. If the POs and PSOs attainment value is below the target, an essential remedial action has been taken.
